Hubner 1819 - The Danaid Eggfly

Koh Samui and Koh Pha Ngan.

A surprisingly rare species on the Islands. The species shows remarkable sexual dimorphism. The females are superb mimics of the Danaid, *Danaus chrysippus*. The males can be seperated from the similar *H. bolina*, by the presence of a black costal spot on the hindwing underside.

This species can be found arround secondary vegetation.

Early Stages


Known, but not pictured.
