Koh Samui only.

A common forest species. This is easily mistaken for the equally common *C. intermedia*, but can be distinguished by having two small dark subapical spots, whereas the latter only has one.

It is a weak flyer. Typical of the Genus, when it rests, it keeps its wings open making it very difficult to photograph the undersides.
