Linnaeus 1767 - Common Banana Skipper

The English name says it all! This large species is very common and found everywhere its hostplant, Banana, is grown, which is nearly every Thai garden. It is crepuscular in habit, more often seen in the evenings than early morning. During the day, it rests in deep shade.
