# Cephrenes acalle niasicus



A very common species which can be found everywhere on the island. It is especially fond of visiting gardens should they have lantana plants.

It is easily mistaken for *Telicota* species, but the male does not have any secondary sexual characterics, whilst the *Telicota* species have a prominent discal stigma on the forewing.
