

Not a common species. This has been found at all altitudes on the Island, but most frequently at higher elevations. It is most likely to be encountered at the edge of forests and near orchards. The female is dimorphic, having two named forms, the brighter *f. subrata* and the paler (commoner) *f. neftina*

Larval Foodplant

Adenanthera pavonia (Papipionacaea), Glochidon eriocarpum and Glochidon rubrum (both Euphorbiacaea), Mussaenda flava, Mussaenda kerrii, Mussaenda phillippica and Mussaendra sanderiana (all Rubiacaea)

Range

Peninsular Thailand and the Malay Peninsular. Other subspecies from India to South China, Sumatra, Borneo, Java and islands off the west coast of Sumatra.
