## Westwood 1851 - The Apefly

A very small, common species, often found in gardens flying arround plants infested with scale insects.

The English name is very unattractive, but if one looks carefully at the underwings, it actually possesses a very attractive set of striae. The name actually comes from the shape of the species's pupa, which resemble the head of a monkey.
