Linnaeus 1758 - The Common Mime

A very interesting species occurring in two form groups, a brown one and a black/grey striped group. One of each group has been found, so far, on Samui, *f. onpape* for the former, and *f. dissimillima* for the latter. Of the two, *f. dissimillima* is by far the more common.

Both groups mimic various members of the *Danainae* family, with varying degrees of success (the Brown group being rather better at mimicing *Euploea* species than the Black/grey group are of *Ideopsis*, *Parantica* and *Tirumala* species).

This butterfly is not uncommon, can be found in secondary growth, and often visits gardens to feed on Ixora and Lantana flowers. It is interesting to note that the larval foodplants have strong smelling leaves used locally in making soap, and the male adult butterfly, if smelt close to (not recommended), exhibit a perfumed fragrance (the females less so).
